All About Me: Fiction & Non-Fiction Writing (Grades 4-12) Online

8 Weeks: March 18-May 12, 2019

What better way to *write what you know* than to write about yourself? But how well do you know yourself? This writing course will encourage both reluctant and inspired writers to think deeply and communicate clearly. In the process, students will improve their understanding of the six traits of writing: ideas, organization, voice, sentence fluency, word choice, and conventions.

Students enrolled as **fully online** learners have access to the same online discussions and activities as the face-to-face students. In addition, our website presents the activities and content discussed in the live classroom. Students will interact with other students and the teacher via weekly discussion forums and activities. Each week the student will post a writing assignment that the teacher will review (via email).

ONLINE COURSE SCHEDULE: (Fully online students should be reading at or above 6th grade level) Students have one week to complete the weekly lesson activities. Activities are grouped by proficiency level. This class runs "asynchronously" (participants to do not need to be online at the same time). **Tuition: \$100**

#8	Poetry	Poetry. Students will write a poem about an important event,
	(word choice, voice)	person, or place in their lives.
