## Magazine Creation: Fiction & Non-fiction Writing (Grades 4-12) Online

8 Weeks: Jan 7-March 3, 2019

Instructor: Cyndy McKinley

This writing course is aimed at both reluctant and inspired writers. We will study the parts of a magazine and create a class magazine to be published on our website. Each student will contribute one story or article, and at least one supplementary item (crossword puzzle, illustration, etc.) In the process, students will improve their understanding of the six traits of writing: ideas, organization, voice, sentence fluency, word choice, and conventions.

Students enrolled as **fully online** learners will have access to the same online discussions and activities as the face-to-face students. In addition, our website presents the activities and content discussed in the live classroom. Students will interact with other students and the teacher via weekly discussion forums and activities. Each week the student will post a writing assignment that the teacher will review (via email).

ONLINE COURSE SCHEDULE: (Fully online students should be reading at or above 6<sup>th</sup> grade level) Students have one week to complete the weekly lesson activities. Activities are grouped by proficiency level. This class runs "asynchronously" (participants to do not need to be online at the same time). **Tuition: \$100**
